The project

The MED-InA project proposes to develop a «Zero Waste» methodology adapted to the public policies of Mediterranean cities, aiming to reduce the amount of waste through prevention, reuse and recycling at local level. To adapt this approach to the Mediterranean context, the project is based on a wide consultation of local stakeholders (public, private, civil society), which places citizens at the heart of the process and strongly promotes the «low tech low cost» approach. This methodology is tested in 3 pilot cities: Irbid (Jordan), La Marsa (Tunisia) and Carcaixent (Spain).

Project goals

- Develop a «Zero Waste» methodology adapted to the Mediterranean context by focusing on change in citizen behaviour.
- Shift municipal waste management from «treating more and more waste» to «treating less by preventing waste».
- Support synergies between municipal stakeholders and innovative companies in the circular economy for optimal and innovative waste management.

- Manage project communication, dissemination and capitalisation activities
- Produce the «Zero Waste» methodological guide.
- Coordinate the exchange of experience and good practices between partners and other Zero Waste pioneering communities.
- Draft a White Paper for advocacy and policy recommendations.
