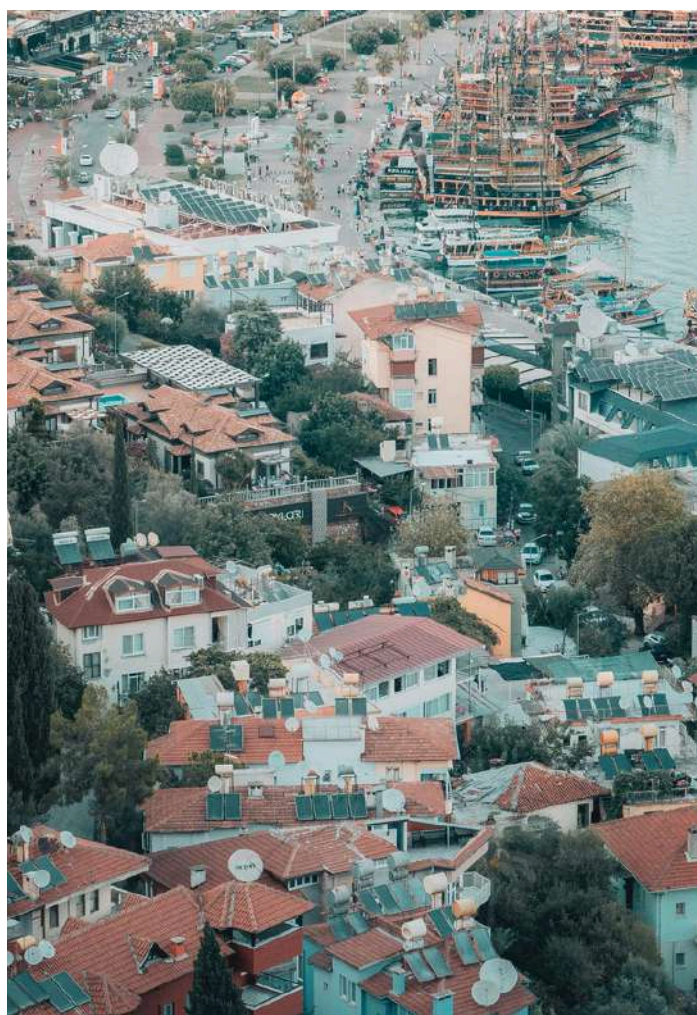

THE VOICE OF THE MEDITERRANEANS

A collaborative process led by AVITEM, this international declaration promotes the resilience of coastal areas across the Mediterranean. Developed through participatory workshops in Marseille, Alexandria, Nice, and Muğla, bringing together local authorities, experts, and stakeholders: it addresses water management, climate risk prevention, and coastal governance.

Presented at UNOC 3 in Nice as an advocacy tool, it strengthens coordination among Mediterranean actors and aligns with the Coalition of Coastal Cities and Regions of the World, affirming a shared approach to sustainability and coastal protection in the face of climate challenges.

MANIFESTO OF CITIES AND TERRITORIES OF CULTURE AND ECOLOGY

A manifesto promoting Mediterranean cultures in all their dimensions (heritage, etc.) as a lever for regional future. It invites local authorities, researchers, and citizens to integrate artists, creatives, and cultural policy actors into territorial planning practices for greater ecological sustainability.

In 2025, the manifesto was widely disseminated within Mediterranean networks and enriched by the commitment of signatories from diverse territories during the Izmir Symposium (elected officials, cultural institutions, territorial actors), reaffirming their adherence to these principles and their will to implement integrated approaches.

MARSEILLE DECLARATION FOR SUSTAINABLE DRINKING WATER MANAGEMENT

Born from a participatory workshop gathering local authorities, experts, and Mediterranean partners, the Marseille Declaration sets a framework for integrated, solidarity-based, and sustainable water management.

Presented at the 10th World Water Forum in Bali in 2024, it places local and regional authorities at the heart of integrated water management and establishes commitments toward sober demand, diversified and decarbonized production, and plural governance.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES

Sustainably renew and improve the living environment of Bourj Hammoud, a densely populated city on the outskirts of Beirut, facing ecological, economic, and social challenges.

Combine long-term vision with immediate, co-constructed actions involving all local stakeholders.



2025: A Pivotal Year for the Project

The project completed its pre-operational phase and prepared for implementation. Two field missions enabled: co-construction with local actors, finalization of the strategic plan and its practical guide, stabilization of 11 pilot projects, as well as 2 guides on "Resilience of Public Spaces" and "Heritage Architecture".

This comprehensive set of outputs allows the city to plan its development for the next 10 years, in operational coordination with key partners such as: ONU-Habitat, UNOPS, KfW, Norwegian Refugee Council, Veolia Foundation, CMA CGM.

2025: Cultivated Territories Review

Three Open Forums fed into the drafting of the Manifesto of Mediterranean Cities of Culture and Ecology and Collective Action Guides (prefiguring tools for concrete projects/Living Labs): Nice - Transformation of cultural practices ; Vitrolles - Territorial synergies; Bastia/Ajaccio - Cultural rights and heritage.

The Izmir Symposium (September 4–5) marked the project's culmination with the official signing of the Manifesto, sealing the commitment of partner communities.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES

2025 : FEAST in Action

Exchanges between partner territories, mobilized experts, and initial local strategies: "Ecovillages" in rural (Corsica) and urban (Sainte-Marthe, Marseille) areas. Agrotourism trails (Albania).

Highlights: Marseille, the 72 Hours of Urban Ecology brought together researchers, local authorities, and practitioners around sustainable food and agroecology. Arghjusta è Muricciu (Corsica), the 2nd Mediterranean Meeting (European Heritage Days) facilitated experience-sharing and showcased agroecological practices in a festive setting. The 3rd meeting is scheduled for Spring 2026 in Haute-Corse.

PROJET OBJECTIVES

The interregional cooperation project strengthens collaboration among European territories to address multi-hazards related to water (floods, droughts, coastal flooding, salinization, pollution, etc.). It builds on knowledge and experience sharing, planning processes and innovative solutions, plural governance and economic models.

At the heart of the project lies the transfer of best practices.



2025 Review: Launch of the Cooperation

On September 19, 2025, WaterAdapt was officially launched in Marseille during the first partner meeting, marking the birth of a community of European actors united to address water-related challenges. At the regional level, this year also enabled the federation of key partners around active sharing of knowledge and best practices, sustainable solutions, pilot actions. This dynamic is essential to strengthen strategic planning in the Sud Region, with a focus on the SRADET (Regional Scheme for Sustainable Development, Energy, and Climate) and the Climate Plan.

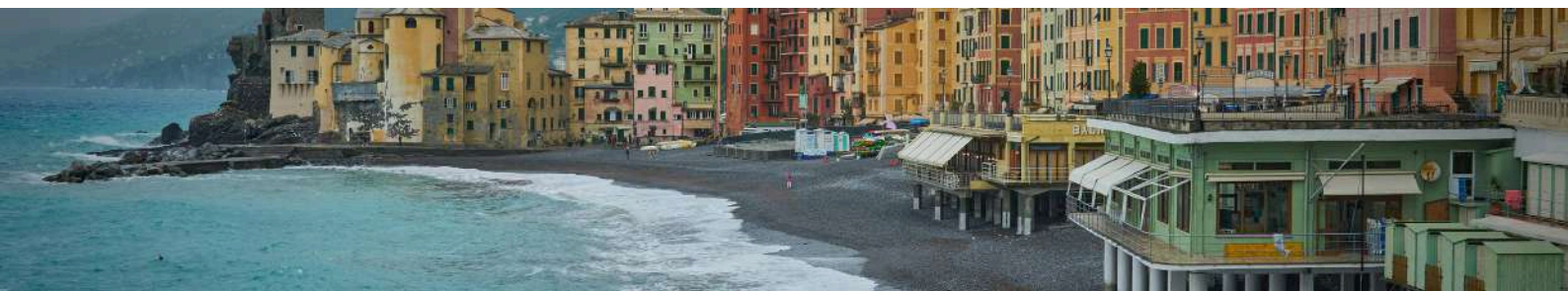

PROJET OBJECTIVES

TRATT'Eau assesses the risks of coastal flooding in the Mediterranean and supports the relocation of economic activities threatened by rising waters. The project develops mapping, analysis, and planning tools to strengthen territorial resilience, thanks to Franco-Italian collaboration and a structured approach for sustainable adaptation.



2025 Review: Launch and Initial Steps

The TRATT'Eau project, officially launched on February 1, 2025, began its first year by focusing on validating scientific hypotheses about rising water threats, evaluating land mobilization strategies, raising awareness among local stakeholders about risks and adaptation solutions.

These preparatory efforts are essential to ensure the relevance and effectiveness of future actions.

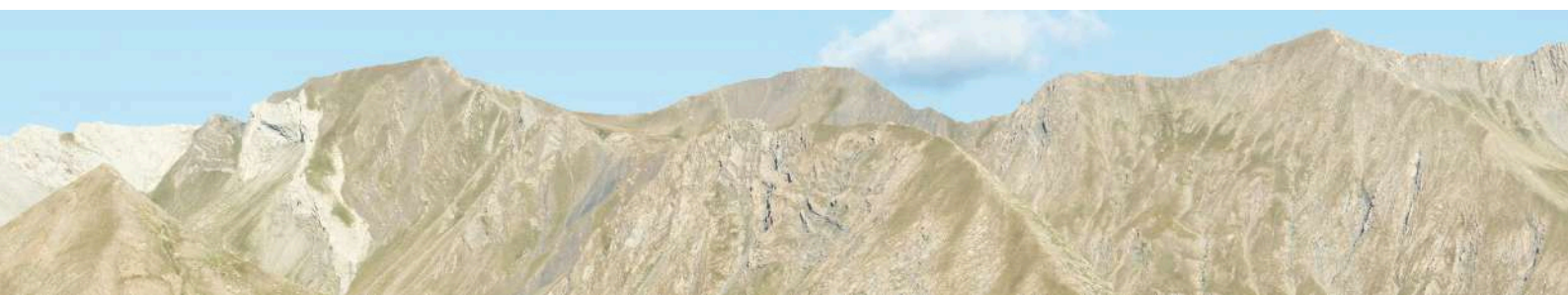

PROJET OBJECTIVES

Following the record drought of summer 2022 in the Franco-Italian Alps, this project strengthens territorial resilience in the face of water shortages. It combines knowledge of water resources, natural storage and optimization solutions tested on pilot sites, and the mobilization of public and citizen stakeholders around a cross-border action plan.



2025: From Diagnosis to Operational Master Plan

In 2025, the SeTe project enters a critical phase after ten months of field analysis conducted by partners to prepare the study and implementation of nature-based solutions and infrastructure (e.g., hydraulic drilling, wetland restoration). The main goal is now to develop a strategic document to guide field interventions in each of the pilot cities. This year is marked by the consortium's participation in the Azuréennes de l'Eau conference and the preparation of a Living Lab on cross-border water governance in the era of climate change, scheduled for Menton in early 2026.

The Cool Noons project improves the adaptation of Mediterranean cities to heatwaves by creating cooling pathways and testing urban and natural solutions for thermal comfort, co-designed with residents, local authorities, and stakeholders.

Pilot cities: Marseille, Lisbon, Imola, Budva, Dubrovnik.



2025 Review: Operational Tests and Promotion

The Cool Noons project has deployed and validated cooling pathways and climate adaptation solutions in several Mediterranean cities. To embed this approach in the territories, participatory workshops involved residents, visitors, and local stakeholders, while a photo contest on urban heat raised awareness of climate issues. Result: Operational and reproducible recommendations, providing local authorities with a clear framework to mitigate urban warming and improve quality of life in cities.

PROJET OBJECTIVES

REPper strengthens repair, reuse, and refurbishment industries. The project supports SMEs in the repair sector by developing training programs for repair technicians and trainers, establishing a transnational service network, and promoting a culture of repair through workshops, awareness campaigns, and repair festivals.



2025 Review: Transnational Networking

In 2025, the project consolidated its network of hubs, resource centers, and digital platforms dedicated to repair and reuse, connecting local stakeholders, institutions, and citizens. A highlight of the year was the 2nd Repair Festival in Thessaloniki (Greece), which brought together hundreds of participants for roundtables and hands-on workshops. The 1st Repair Festival was organized by AVITEM in 2024 in Marseille, in a priority neighborhood of the city's urban policy and in partnership with local social and solidarity economy associations.

PROJET OBJECTIVES

Using human behavior insights to transform tourism practices.

A project involving 80 SMEs in France, Italy, Norway, and Slovenia, testing simple, low-cost, and effective solutions to help travelers and tourism operators make eco-responsible decisions.



2025: Tangible Results for Sustainable Tourism

The First Mile project led to the creation of a collection of 30 best practices and an operational toolkit: simple, low-cost, and tested solutions to reduce the environmental footprint of tourism stakeholders (e.g., water fountains vs. plastic bottles, rainwater harvesting, electric bikes and transport incentives, 100% local menus, smart timers, etc.). The results were presented at a final event in Bologna, underscoring the ambition to scale these innovative methods and create a ripple effect among European tourism professionals, driving a concrete, collective, and inspiring ecological transition.

PROJET OBJECTIVES

CEFoodCycle develops a smart digital solution to combat food waste, optimize packaging, and promote resource reuse. Using artificial intelligence, the project connects food industry stakeholders to identify resource and CO₂ savings while strengthening sustainable and circular competitiveness in the Alps.



2025: Solutions Against Food Waste

The project concluded with the pilot testing of the "IDLCASS" digital platform, an AI tool designed to reduce waste and measure CO₂ impact for all professional food industry stakeholders. In Nice, a qualitative study on the behavioral barriers and incentives for sorting biowaste in the cafés-hotels-restaurants sector complemented the trial of a cargo bike collection system in the Old Town's narrow streets, inaccessible to trucks. The findings were shared with regional institutional actors, professionals, business support organizations, public authorities, and European partners.

PROJET OBJECTIVES

Exploring nature-based social prescriptions to improve physical and mental well-being, reduce isolation, and strengthen social cohesion. This project brings together researchers, health professionals, environmental experts, and social actors to test activities in natural spaces, with the goal of integrating them sustainably into public policies.



2025 Review: Finalizing Tests and Promotion

In 2025, the RECETAS project completed its pilot tests in cities and prepared to publish research findings, assessing the impact of interventions on well-being and social inclusion. The consortium boosted the project's European and international visibility, including through a public hearing at the European Parliament, and continued engaging local stakeholders and policymakers. A workshop on social prescriptions, organized by AVITEM in partnership with the City of Marseille, targeted healthcare and social services, local authorities, and NGOs. The event produced a roadmap for public action.

Metropolitan Seminar 2025 Immersive Experience in Bologna

From June 30 to July 4, 2025, AVITEM—alongside the Città Metropolitana di Bologna and the Comune di Bologna—organized an immersive seminar for 15 urban planning and territorial development professionals from Mediterranean countries (France, Italy, Lebanon, Albania, Morocco, Turkey, Tunisia).

This hands-on training explored Bologna’s metropolitan strategy, a model of resilient, inclusive, and attractive urbanism, through meetings with local stakeholders and visits to operational projects.

Bologna is renowned for its value-driven urbanism (solidarity, social cohesion, sustainability) and its pioneering approach to urban revitalization, dating back to the 1960s. As a heritage city, it has adapted to a new society where tradition and innovation shape its metropolitan project to address contemporary resilience challenges.

INSTITUTIONAL VISIBILITY

In 2025, AVITEM's communication efforts focused on strengthening the agency's visibility and highlighting its actions in support of territorial transitions and Mediterranean cooperation. The content shared showcased AVITEM's expertise and the partnerships developed with local authorities, institutions, and academic stakeholders.

DIGITAL AND EDITORIAL PRODUCTION

AVITEM's digital presence became a key tool for outreach, with 158,930 visitors to its website and 4,636 LinkedIn followers (322 publications) between March 2025 and March 2026. To make its work accessible, the agency also produced a variety of editorial materials, including reports, summaries, interactive maps, flyers, and brochures.

PROJECT PROMOTION

European projects and territorial cooperation were at the heart of AVITEM's communication strategy. Through dedicated digital platforms and targeted editorial content, AVITEM disseminated the tangible results of its initiatives while fostering communities of partners across the Mediterranean and Europe.

EVENTS AND PUBLICATIONS

Seminars, forums, webinars, and editorial materials helped share knowledge generated by projects and facilitate exchanges between local authorities, researchers, and actors in the ecological transition. These initiatives reinforced AVITEM's role as a platform for cooperation and expertise sharing.

In 2025, AVITEM strengthened its institutional visibility and reputation by highlighting its expertise in territorial transitions and Mediterranean cooperation. It was a year dedicated to promoting flagship actions, strategic partnerships, and its key role in territorial innovation.
